**Directions**

From Leatherhead – through Great Bookham on the A246, after Groveside Road and then Dobbes Garden Centre on left. turn right into Rectory Lane. Straight over mini roundabout into Little Bookham Street. Continue 3 km to "Bookham Tunnel Car Park" (just past the station).

From Guildford – On A246; 2km past Effingham traffic lights; Turn left into Rectory Lane, then as above.

Regarding parking I quote the hare: "This is a PayByPhone National Trust car park and there is no machine, so parkees either need the app on their phone or to park on a nearby public road.

## DTT AND MRS ROBINSON ENTERTAIN A LARGE PACK

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Last week Tequil'Over echoed a sentiment you will remember my offering recently: the lack of continuity between front runners and pack; indeed, the disappearance of the pack. 30 odd years ago, when we were in our 40s and 50s, there was a great spread in speeds, from Rambo to Sister Anna, but we had a pack: the difference, I suggest, is that most of us ran most of the time. This does not happen nowadays. I can quite see how front runners will lose touch with those who walk all, or virtually all, of the trail, and not at the vigorous pace of Tossler or Dr Death: we need many more younger runners!

Now today we did seem to have a semblance of a pack, at least until after we had turned back south below Polesden

young, or youngish, parents, preferably with their children. SH3 is not alone in confronting this problem, as Doggystyle confirmed, but it is especially acute here.

The Daily Mail team, when people asked Johnson to resign, came up with the headline "Don't they know there's a war on?" Were they revealing their own ignorance, or were they dismissing contemptuously the ignorance of their readers? Changing Prime Ministers in war time is very much part of our history: Lloyd George took over from Asquith in 1916, Churchill from Chamberlain in 1940, Eden resigned after the Suez fiasco, Major took over from Thatcher as our troops went out to Kuwait. If you want to go back further, Palmerston took over from Lord Aberdeen when the Crimean War made the

Lacey; after that the very fast 6 – you know who they are! - disappeared over the horizon. (In your count, remember Popeye is a law unto himself, and that No Nookie was not here today). And that still left a dozen or so, led by J. Arthur, who could regard themselves as a pack, except that today there was an unusually large turnout, and we found ourselves greatly outnumbered when we reached the bucket. I was impressed that this group included 'Arfur Pint, now fully recovered from her hip operation.

Popeye commented that this is very familiar territory. (Most people seem to recall best the time we ran from here in snow, but

we have been here often.) Yes, but the territory round Polesden Lacey is equally well known, and the hares today were original in connecting the two, taking us north from the car park. Usually we go east, or west, or south. It was a good trail, avoiding roads, with plenty of twists and turns – though one very long path, due south on the return with no checks to entertain us, became a tad tedious

At the bucket Rosemary agreed she needed a new handle: I propose Riveter, in memory of the Rosie of poster fame during WW2, since her conversation is indeed riveting. I spoke also to Kelinchi's son, an undergraduate, who said sadly that no one ever remembered him, though he has been out with us before. We really do need runners of his age, and of course
