We were joined by North Hants. which perhaps explains why Atalanta, yes, Atalanta, commented that progress was faster today than usual. In fact I took 75 minutes, for 4.5 miles, so fairly normal, but perhaps she and other front runners took a good deal less time. We had also the company of a quiet, shy, self-effacing hasher, who pretended to have done the whole trail, although in reality abandoning us after a few minutes. But he hates being noticed, so his handle is not included here.

Now, SH3 have hashed here rather often; I tried to think where a trail could go to be original. Perhaps to the west? In fact we just went north and came back again, so all very traditional, all very well-known territory, which included the hill fort (Iron Age, still in use during Roman times) which notice boards in our car park described. There was also a puzzling notice "Night Priority Swim": perhaps the locals splash in the moonlight?

We did have other SH3 runners keeping up with North Hants, Kelinchi, Doug, Popeye, Simple, Le so were Pro. we not disgraced. The only visitors I could name were Jolly Green Giant (who took a tumble) and Old Thumper: I was surprised to see them before the start accompanying Chastity Belt as she laid the last few hundred metres of her trail. She and 'IsKnees went to

some trouble to ensure no part of the trail was flat for more than a short spell; they seemed to include every slope on Puttenham Common. One place was so steep that descent was slower than ascent, at which Bonn Bugle leading our little group; we did not seem to be on flour there, though other hashers could be discerned well ahead of us plainly on trail. But certainly this was an ultra-hilly way of enjoying the Common. Well, the start was plainly intended to emphasise also the ponds meres?) which (lakes, ornament the southern end of the Common: another notice forbade any fishing before June 2022, which today seemed somewhat superseded. (Highway Authorities are even more hopeless at removing outdated notices).

Doug commented that the solutions to checks were at great distances from circles, a modern tendency I continue to deplore – while still acknowledging the persistence of front runners who nevertheless find these solutions.

Recent trails have been rich in green alkanet, at once an attractive flower and a weed almost impossible to dislodge from a garden. This seems to be recent; I have no memories of it from the garden of my childhood, where dandelions were the worst offender. Those of you who garden will at once recognise the plant; those

who do not will wonder what I am writing about. The topic seems never to be mentioned in ordinary conversations. (Yes, this is unsurprising: most conversations are about those engaged in speaking. How we all love rabbiting on about ourselves!) Alkanet is related to borage and forgetme-nots, but is bigger and more flamboyant. I bring to gardening good-will but little knowledge; I do still maintain a front garden, now a rarity in our road, where almost everyone has concreted over the area. This is very bad for rainfall, which has to run off somewhere: I suspect people are reluctant to be seen at work by passers-by, and think of a garden somewhere to relax, which no one will do in the front. All forms of gardening, weeding included, are therapeutic; the Peter Sellers character in Being There, simple or not, would have made a good President.
